## **Sharing Time**

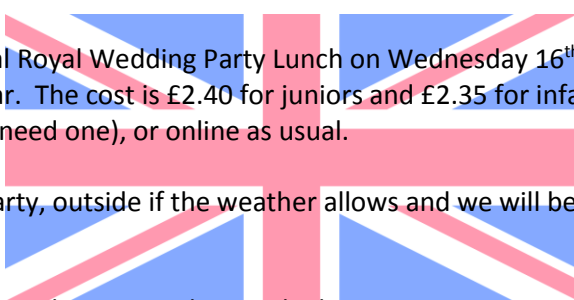
