

Put on and take off his/her own coat.










Go to the toilet alone and flush it.


We will also introduce your child to all the wonderful people who help us here at Eyton. In this way, your child's transition into full time education will, we hope, be both happy and secure.

## Do I need a uniform?


No, but we are very pleased that all children wear the school uniform consisting of grey trousers or skirt and a white or green t shirt with a green jumper.

Children enjoy running, climbing and playing on the large apparatus, which is all part of their curriculum. Please send your child in clothes which allow them to use this equipment.

Please dress your child in clothes they can manage. Buckles, braces and straps are difficult and frustrating for the children.

Shoes are very important! We spend a lot of time on the floor, so comfy school shoes are vital.
