childcare and childcare costs; parenting and parenting support; child development, behaviour, sleep etc; relationship support, including domestic abuse; disability and additional needs; building confidence, reconnecting with training and employment. Parent Support Advisers are able to help parents and carers who face a number of challenges, not only with information and advice but also the necessary help they may need to access appropriate support. This additional help is particularly useful for parents/carers who have learning or reading difficulties, whose first language is not English or Welsh, who are undergoing a period of high stress or who are facing a number of complex issues.

We would like to congratulate Mrs Julie in our kitchen for a very successful Environmental Health inspection this week. The school kitchen has received another glowing 4-rating. A top-marks 5-rating would have been awarded had it not have been for a small area that needs re-plastering which we are sure you will agree is beyond Mrs Julie's duties as cook!
