## NEWSLETTER 26<sup>th</sup> June 2020

Dear Parents,

Here are the arrangements for the check in, catch up and prepare week beginning **29<sup>th</sup> June 2020:**

Parents are to drop off and collect all children from the gates on the pavement. Only children and staff are to come onto school premises.

### **Monday: Year 4 arrive 8.55am depart 3.05pm**

Year 4 arrive and leave by the side gate as usual.

**Tuesday + Wednesday: Reception arrive 9.05 am at the front gate and depart at 2.55pm** from the front gate. They will enter the building through the front door.

**Thursday + Friday: Year 2 and Year 3 arrive 8.55am depart 3.05pm** and will be dropped at the small, usual gate. They will be met and taken in through the side gate as usual. They will be met by you at the gate, in the usual way.

### **All week: Key worker children arrive 8.50am depart 3.20pm.**

Key worker children will be met at the driveway entrance, come in through the green playground gates and go straight into to hall through the fire door. They will be dismissed in the same way.

Sandwiches are to be brought from home in disposable bags. No water bottles are to be brought into school, we have paper cups for the water dispenser.

Sandwich bags will be double bagged and disposed of in accordance with the school and county procedures. Nothing will be brought home.

Please don't pack yoghurts that need a spoon to be provided, or the yoghurts in tubes that the children tend to chew, then ask staff to open with scissors.

Carton drinks that can be thrown away are fine, as are, sadly, single use plastic drinks.

Please do not bring PE kits, any toys, pencil cases or any equipment in from home.

The cloakroom is not to be used, coats will go on chairs.

We have had to throw away the dirty sandwich boxes and wet swimming kits from March, because of the health and hygiene risk. There are a few things left in the cloakroom. If these are not collected by the children, when they are in school, they will also be disposed of at the end of term.

Children must not come to school if they have a cough, a temperature, loss or change of sense of taste or smell, or if they are feeling unwell. We would not want children who are sneezing, perhaps due to hay fever in school, because of the droplets in the classrooms.

We would ask that if your child becomes distressed as they arrive at school, that you go home, calm them down, wipe their hands and face, change clothing if necessary, and try again later.

Clothing should be very simple. Uniform is optional. No jewellery must be worn. New clothing should be worn every day. No PE kit is needed.

Children will have to do exactly as they are told and follow the rules as directed. Children whose behaviour puts others at risk will have to go home.

Parents are not to come into school. If you urgently need to talk to a member of staff, please phone school and speak to us that way.

Please ensure that your child is aware of the 2 metre social distancing rule and is used to using hand sanitiser. We will be doing, "Wash your hands," to the Happy Birthday tune in school. Hand sanitisers will be available in all the classrooms for your child's use.

Specific toilets will be allocated to the children on their days in school.

These strong rules are put in place to ensure that everyone stays safe and well. We ALL need to adhere to these rules to keep safe, so there can be no exceptions.

We are all looking forward to welcoming you back to school, and we'll see some of you next week.
