


## Home Learning Pack – 21/01/21

Thursday	
Literacy	<p>This week we are practicing grammar, which is the rules that tell us the way that our sentences are put together. Today and tomorrow we will be looking at prefixes and suffixes. Prefixes are chunks we put at the beginning of words to change their meaning. Have a look at page 2 to see some prefixes and what they do to the words they are attached to. Use the table on page 2 to write a word using each of the prefixes there. I have put a clue next to each one to help you figure one out or you can think of one of your own. There are also 2 challenge tasks on Purple Mash to do with prefixes. The Superhero one is a little bit easier and the Window one is quite hard. Choose one to do or have a go at both if you really want to challenge yourself.</p>
Numeracy	<p>We are looking at measuring temperature this week. Start off by using this website (<a href="http://www.topmarks.co.uk/Flash.aspx?f=Temperaturev2">www.topmarks.co.uk/Flash.aspx?f=Temperaturev2</a>) to practice reading thermometers. Start with the ones in the green circle, then if you feel confident practice with the others on the top row. The ones on the bottom row don't just use whole numbers, so you don't need to practice those.</p> <p>On Purple Mash there is a quiz where you need to use this skill to tell me what each thermometer says. Make sure you read which thermometer the question is asking you to read. There are 2 versions. You only have to do one or the other but can try both if you would like to.</p>
	
Topic	<p>One of the most important things that the UK used during the Second World War was a few incredible models of aeroplane. The most famous are the Lancaster Bomber and the Spitfire. 

