




# YSGOL EYTON

Dear Parents,

Welsh Government have shut schools until February half-term. I will keep you updated as information comes in.

## ONLINE LEARNING

The teachers are going to trial some live online learning sessions. They will be done through Zoom and the teachers will put the password and code onto their class SeeSaw pages. Miss Jesson will trial Tuesday and Thursday. Mrs Collins/Mr Huyton and Miss Dodd will trial Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The teachers will put the times that they will be Zooming, onto their SeeSaw pages. These will be short, 15 minute sessions to check in, stay in touch, explain the activities and feedback to the children. Please make sure that you are in a quiet area and that your speaker is on mute, when your child starts their online session. Some of the sessions will be split into their different year groups. Work will still be posted on the class pages of the school website, SeeSaw, Purple Mash and the class blog. If you cannot access activities, please contact your class teacher or Mrs Whitgreave on the email below. There will be an English, mathematics and topic/other work activity posted with enough for one to be done every day. There will be opportunities to ask questions during the live, online sessions.

Advice and instructions are coming in all the time. Things are different this lockdown, and we will keep up to date and keep you up to date with the changes and expectations.

## KEY WORKER CHILD CARE

We are providing childcare for Key Worker's children. If you need Key Worker childcare, please email Mrs Whitgreave ASAP on:

Please be aware that there are specific criteria for Key Worker provision that the school is duty-bound to follow.

Please drop children off at the main footpath gate at 8.50am and collect at 3.15pm.

Please bring sandwiches and leave bags, drinks bottles, toys, pencil cases etc, at home.

The children will be doing the work from their class online provision on the days they are in school.

If your child displays any of the Covid19 symptoms, please keep them at home and **contact 119** for further advice.

If you have been in direct contact with someone with Covid19, please isolate for the time directed by track and trace and **contact 119** if you need further advice.

If your child becomes unwell or starts to display symptoms in school, they will go to a safe isolation area and you will need to be able to come and collect your child immediately.

Please wear a mask and keep social distancing when you drop off and collect your child.

I will keep you updated with the information as soon as I can, after I receive it.

Do stay safe and well everyone and we all look forward to welcoming you all back into school as soon as we can.
