We are looking for donations of snacks for our after-school club. Please feel free to drop them at the school office.


Hire of the school hall

Vaccination centers in North Wales offer drop-in clinics to boost protection against flu

If your child missed the flu vaccination in school and you would like them to get vaccinated please see below.

Children and eligible adults will be able to get a free flu vaccine at one of the health board's mass vaccination centres from Monday.

Flu is circulating in North Wales, with hundreds of patients admitted to hospital in recent weeks.

But more than 200,000 people have already boosted their protection by getting a flu vaccine from their GP surgery or community pharmacy this winter.

From Monday January 16, everyone eligible for a flu vaccine will be able to <u>walk into a vaccination clinic without an</u> <u>appointment</u>. Many <u>GP surgeries</u> and <u>community pharmacies</u> will also continue to offer the vaccine.

Free painless nasal spray flu vaccines are available for all children aged two and three (age on August 31 2022) and all school children from Reception to Year 11.

Adults aged 50 and over, plus priority high-risk groups including pregnant women, health workers, carers, and people with underlying health conditions are also eligible for the flu vaccine.

Vaccination centers will hold dedicated walk-in clinics for children on set dates. More information about eligibility, clinic dates and times, and how you can get a flu vaccine is available at https://bcuhb.nhs.wales/health-advice/immunisations/flu/. New dates will be updated regularly.
