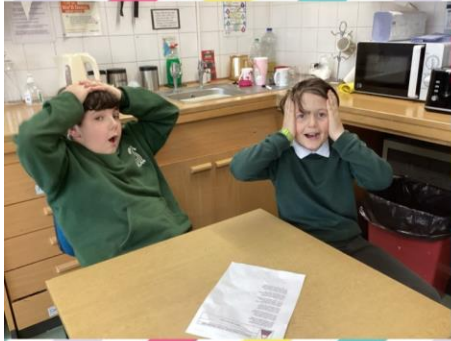
We made promises to help the environment.
