Funded Education for 3 year olds

If your child has their 3rd birthday before August 31st, 2026, there are some important dates for school admissions that you need to be aware of.

If your child's third birthday falls between September 1st and December 31st, you can apply for the January 2026 intake of Funded Early Education and for a September 2026 Nursery place. FEE applications open on September 1st and should be submitted by October 24th.

If your child's third birthday falls between January 1st and March 31st, you can apply for the **April 2026** intake of Funded Early Education <u>and</u> for a September 2026 Nursery place. FEE applications open on November 3rd and should be submitted by **December 19th**.

For all children whose 3rd birthday falls before August 31st, you can apply for a September 2026 Nursery place. Nursery applications open on January 6th and should be submitted by February 16th.

If your child is eligible for both Funded Early Education and Nursery, you will need to make two **separate** applications. Securing a Funded Early Education place does not guarantee a Nursery place at the same school, and securing a Nursery place does not guarantee a full time Reception place at the same school the following year. Each phase of education requires a new application, and each year the available places are allocated in line with the admissions policy on our website. It is very important to apply on time because late applications are considered after applications that we receive on time.

If you are employed or in education, you could also be eligible for the Childcare Offer for Wales. This offer provides a combined 30 hours of education and childcare provision. You should apply to School Admissions for the education element of this offer (Funded Early Education, Nursery or both). Eligible parents can then make a separate application for the childcare element of the offer. You can find out more about this offer by visiting www.wrexham.gov.uk/childcare-offer-wales



10 Hours Funded Early Education For 3 Year Olds

Spring and Summer Terms

A funded place will be provided for the Spring and Summer Terms for children whose 3rd birthday falls between

1 September to 31 December

Summer Term

A funded place will be provided for the Summer Term for children whose 3rd birthday falls between

1 January to 31 March

From **September** you can apply for a place for your child in a funded setting for:

5 sessions a week of **2 hours** a day **or**

4 sessions a week of 2.5 hours a day
